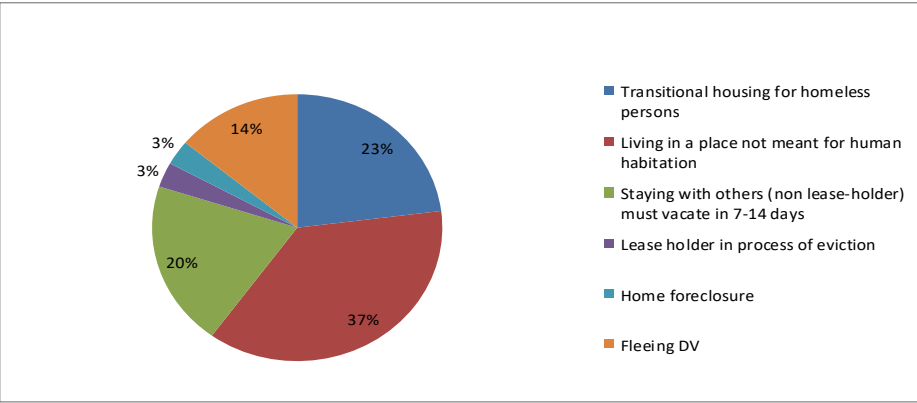
Barriers to Housing

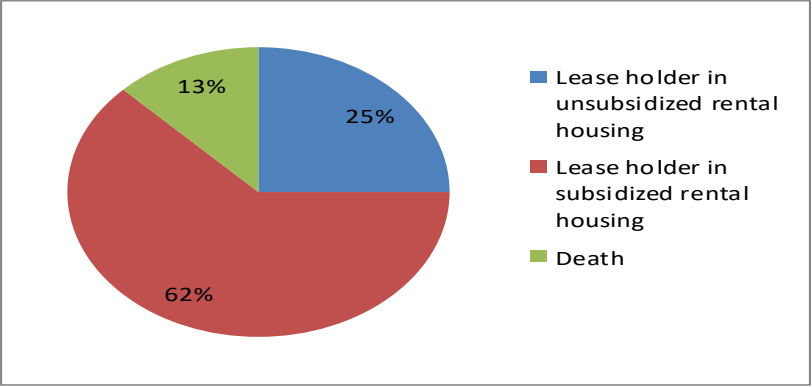
Housing Status at Intake:
