## **ABOUT CHICAGO HOUSE:**

Established in 1985 amidst the height of the AIDS crisis, Chicago House initially served as a vital housing resource and hospice for individuals living with and dying from HIV/AIDS. Today, our foremost mission is to empower those living with or susceptible to HIV/AIDS to lead healthy, dignified lives. Chicago House shines as a nationally recognized community model in the realm of social service agencies, with remarkable client outcomes, including suppressed viral loads, improved overall health, and enhanced self-sufficiency, all contributing to our overarching goal of ending homelessness for the most marginalized in our community.

Chicago House takes pride in being the leading provider of housing solutions for the diverse identities within our LGBTQIA+ community — including Black and Brown members throughout the Chicagoland area — who are often underserved and at heightened risks for homelessness and unemployment. In addition to our housing programs, our innovative wraparound services directly address the social determinants of health, including employment and linkage to care, serving as essential foundations for dignified living.



Over the past two years, Chicago House has reaffirmed its commitment to the core mission, expanding our housing resources by ~75% through the introduction of new facilities on the South and West sides of Chicago. Simultaneously, we have pioneered innovative service models such as TransLife Care, which puts an emphasis on offering legal services and other community-specified needs. Our latest endeavor, Aging in Place, addresses the often-overlooked population of individuals aging with HIV/AIDS — providing stable housing and access to care with the ultimate aim of preventing institutional care for this vulnerable population.



As disparities persist within our social and economic systems, especially for our LGBTQIA+ and Black and Brown communities, demand for our housing and wraparound services vastly surpasses our current capacity to meet it.

We provide compassionate, client-centered support services, including case management, linkage to healthcare, and employment services for the most vulnerable in our communities.
