The mission of the Gaining Ground Program is to empower clients to attain social and economic independence.

Through a monthly rental subsidy, employment counseling and services, and intensive life skills education, participants in the Gaining Ground Program will gain the skills needed to live and work independently in the community.

86 Clients served in **64** Households

- 100% Low or No Income
- 86% Mental Illness
- 70% Substance Use
- 100% Poor Credit
- 36% Felonies

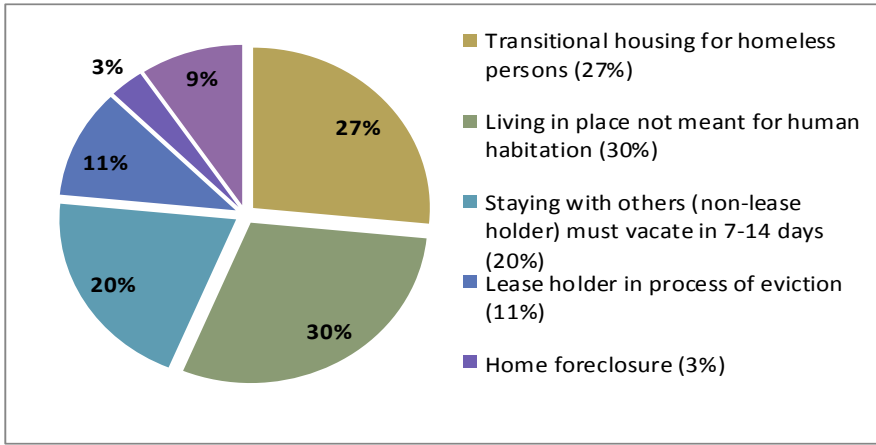

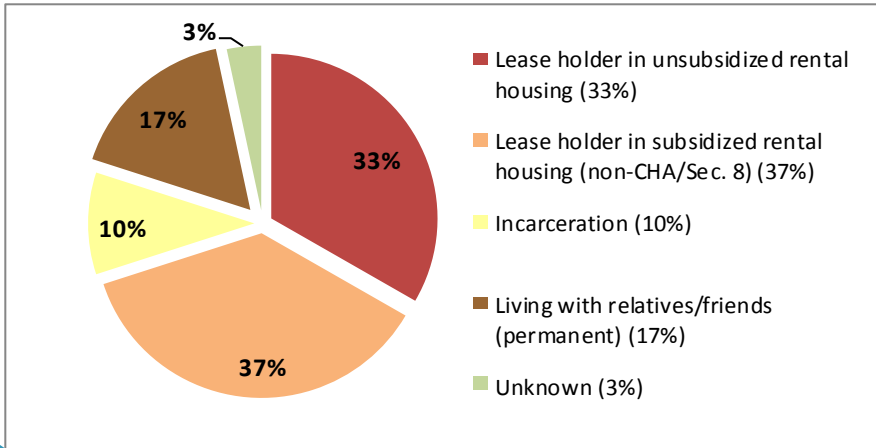
Housing Status at Intake:

- Southside 42%
- Westside 17%

83% of approved applicants housed within their identified **community of origin.**

98% of approved applicants were housed within their identified **community of choice.**
